Celebrate Our "Senior" Seniors on March 22


We're honoring our "SENIOR" seniors on Sunday, March 22 at 3PM with a birthday party. Cake and ice cream will be served and everyone is welcome.

I continue to work closely with our park Manager, Lisa in striving to provide you with the amenities you desire.

We have received a great response to the survey sent to each you in January. As I write this, we are still receiving responses, so the final compilation will likely not be done until the end of February. I will share much of the information at our next Membership Meeting on March 10thth. You may be surprised with some of the results.

Also, *PLEASE* pickup your new Resident Directory, which has been placed in each mail slot in the library. Please check your information to make sure it is correct and if not, contact Dolly Lengel, Lot 252.

We will be seeking volunteers to join some of our committees. These include, but not limited to, the Inside Clubhouse Design/Decoration Committee and the Outside Clubhouse & Pool Area Design/Decoration Committee. These committees will be responsible for determining what needs to be done to keep our community updated and looking the best it can be throughout the year including during the holiday season. Please consider volunteering. Any resident is welcome to contact the committee leaders with suggestions for changes and the committees will discuss them. Only the committees will make changes. These committees will report to the HOA Board and have the support of the Board.

We will also be seeking residents that will take pride in caring for areas around the community. So far, we have residents that take great pride in such things as landscaping improvements, the Nature Trail, Christmas lighting, and offering their time and skills to keep some of amenities looking great. If you have an area you have interest in, please sign up on the Volunteer Signup sheets located inside the Clubhouse and in the mail area. You can also let me know directly. We have volunteers that will be happy to help you. Thanks!

We will be posting a plan for future projects so those who wish to help can be aware of them and make plans to help if desired. The dates of the projects are somewhat flexible due to weather conditions. Some upcoming projects include repairing the entrance that was damaged by an accident, staining the gazebo as directed by the membership at our last meeting, staining the bridge, and possibly relocating the island swing to the area by the gazebo. There will likely be other future projects as we are always looking to improve the community. Some of the mentioned projects may be done prior to the publishing of the Beacon, but I still included them so you are aware of what we are doing to keep our community looking good.

The By-Laws were amended during the February meeting to require the approval of the majority of the attending membership for any changes to take effect. This requires two successive monthly meeting votes of the membership. Other changes include the option of the Board to conduct bi-monthly membership meetings during the summer months. This was added since the population is now primarily full-time residents. Also added was a five-minute limit on discussion time per resident at membership meetings to allow enough time for those who wish to speak.

When visiting the swimming pool, please park your golf carts in the designated Golf Cart parking area at the west end of the Clubhouse parking lot. I have noticed no one is using these spots, yet many car and bike parking areas are full of carts. The vast majority of pool users are quite able to walk the few extra feet from the designated cart parking area leaving the car/truck parking spots for use by those vehicles. Also, do not park on the grass. Single uses do little harm, continual uses cause harm. Thanks

Directions:


- 1. Mix dry ingredients with oil.

As you touch each sculptured moment, life recurs in intimate design -- --


