The Beacon Terrace residents are simply fantastic! Let’s move forward to better days!

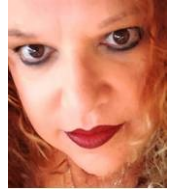

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I would like to start by saying I appreciate each and every one of you! This has been such a trying time for everyone. Please continue to practice the precautions and stay mindful. We want everyone to remain safe and healthy.

Just a few reminders:

The pool and clubhouse are for residents only. The hours are 9 am -5 pm. Clubhouse masks are required. The office is closed unless an appointment is made and then a mask must be worn.

*I would like to ask that everyone update their personal information with the office IE. phone number, email, and emergency contact information. This is very important for ROBO calls and email blasts about information in the community. Also in case of an emergency.

*The food box that was given through Humana and Dedicated was a great success and our residents seemed very pleased with the goodies!

COTTAGE CHEESE JELLO SALAD

This creamy, dreamy Cottage Cheese Jello Salad is one of my favorite treats once the weather turns warm in the spring and summer. It's perfect for potlucks, backyard barbecues, and family reunions!

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 (3 oz.) package Jello, any flavor
- 1 (15 oz.) can crushed pineapple, drained
- 1 (16 oz.) container cottage cheese
- 1 (8 oz.) container Cool Whip, thawed

INSTRUCTIONS : Combine cottage cheese, pineapple, and gelatin in a bowl, stirring well.

Fold the Cool Whip in with the other ingredients until combined. Try not to overmix and deflate the Cool Whip.

Transfer to a clean serving bowl, then cover and refrigerate for 1 hour before serving.

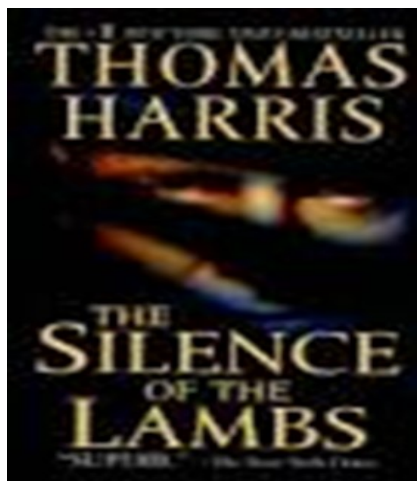

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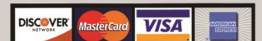
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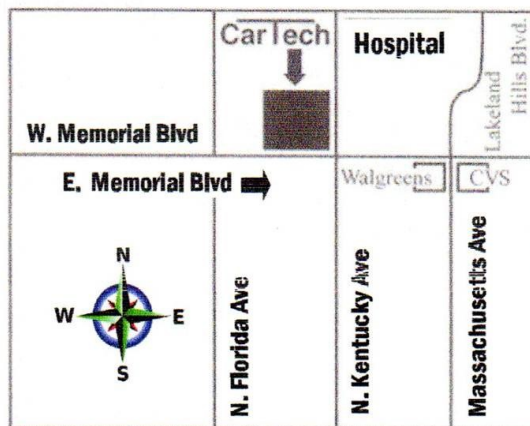
