

### Resident Reminders...from Don Kohnke, HOA President

Please, please do not park your vehicle on the grass. Far too many issues have been created by doing so including broken irrigation and supply pipes creating water outages to repair the breaks. The pipes are not buried very deep since freezing does not occur here. The Florida dirt (basically sand) easily compacts. This is extremely important after some rain when the soil is soft.

Parking on the road after dark is extremely dangerous and not recommended. Our roads are relatively narrow creating blind spots when a vehicle is parked on them after dark. This is a safety issue for those who walk after dark. It also creates issues for emergency vehicles which tend to be wider.

Parking on the road overnight is not allowed!!

It is the time of year when the seasonal residents return. Many of our full-time residents tend to park second vehicles in neighbors' driveways while they are gone, which is great for security, but when they return, they need to find a place for them. The overflow area near the Clubhouse is the place for extra vehicles, either yours or visitors, and should only be used as such.

Golf carts should not be parked in car parking places along Bottlebrush when using the pool. Once seasonal residents return and more vehicles are parked in the overflow area less room remains for those who drive to the mail boxes. The designated golf cart parking area is located at the west end of the Clubhouse parking lot. It is a short walk to the entrance gate for the pool. Please use it.

Please pickup after your dogs. With many new residents, the dog population has increased, so has the need to keep the park clean. Thank you!

A favorite recipe that I wanted to share!

### **Pumpkin Bread**

### **INGREDIENTS**

2 cups all-purpose flour, spooned into measuring cup and leveled-off

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon ground cloves

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1-1/2 sticks (3/4 cup) unsalted butter, softened

2 cups sugar

2 large eggs

1 15-oz can 100% pure pumpkin (I use Libby's)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Preheat the oven to 325°F and set an oven rack in the middle position. Generously grease two 8 x 4-inch loaf pans with butter and dust with flour (alternatively, use a baking spray with flour in it, such as Pam with Flour or Baker's Joy).


In a medium bowl, combine the flour, salt, baking soda, baking powder, cloves, cinnamon, and nut-meg. Whisk until well combined; set aside.

In a large bowl of an electric mixer, beat the butter and sugar on medium speed until just blended. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Continue beating until very light and fluffy, a few minutes. Beat in the pumpkin. The mixture might look grainy and curdled at this point -- that's okay.

Add the flour mixture and mix on low speed until combined.

Turn the batter into the prepared pans, dividing evenly, and bake for 65 - 75 minutes, or until a cake tester inserted into the center comes out clean. Let the loaves cool in the pans for about 10 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

Fresh out of the oven, the loaves have a deliciously crisp crust. If they last beyond a day, you can toast individual slices to get the same fresh-baked effect.





### **HEAR YE! HEAR YE! Evening Bingo has returned!**

Yes, after nearly 30 weeks with no evening Bingo, we are back to an evening schedule. Beginning November 23<sup>rd</sup> Bingo moved to a 6 PM start. This feels closer to normal, yet only residents are permitted to play and social distancing rules and mask usage remain mandatory for the time being.

Each session contains three jackpots, two Odd/Even and one Lucky Number Jackpot. These provide three possible jackpot prizes creating excitement and interest.
