

U.S. Navy Veteran, Jon Norrix,

Anyone among us enjoy famous quotes? I love quotes by Winston Churchill and have a whole collection by Jefferson. But I heard one yesterday that made me stop and think because it's so appropriate for what we've experienced for the past nine months. Quoting our seventh president, Andrew Jackson, "Never take counsel of your fears." That one made me take note as I heard it from one of our residents who used it to refer to life.

Meet Jon Norrix, a U.S. Navy veteran who is likely the most traveled person I have met. If any of you travel, you know it ain't for wimps. And wow, this guy has traveled!

Let's start with Jon being the son of a Japanese mother and an Irish-Scandinavian father who was also a Navy veteran. His mother grew up in Japanese-occupied China. Though Jon's brother was born in Japan, Jon was born in Washington state.

His father's Naval career included service on the Ingersoll DD990, the ship which rescued 44 people who were escaping to the Philippines from Vietnam after Saigon fell. Is it possible Jon inherited some fearlessness from his parents or possibly from his grandparents who served as Christian missionaries in Manchuria?

Having been born in Seattle and then living in Alaska from age 5 to 7 for his dad's 2-year stint there, grass has never had a chance to grow under this sailor's feet. Going from frigid Alaska to a hot and humid Alabama must have taught Jon you really can bloom wherever you planted. In 1978, Jon finished high school in Maryland and completed Boot Camp there [See photo of Jon and his father, 1978—BELOW]



Jon's career on the seas began, taking him to Guam, Japan, Malaysia, Portugal, and Bahrain. In the Navy, he was trained in Electronic Technology including Radar and Coding equipment.

Anyone remember the room-sized computers with the tubes? How far we have come in these few decades!! We're all carrying computers in the palms of our hands or in our back pockets!

With good training, Jon's service included his own 4 years in Alaska. He describes the beauty of the crystal blue ice of Harding Ice Field with the cobalt blue water of Seward and recalls the incredible sight of the night skies where the Milky Way is so beautifully defined when viewed from a ship.

The travels didn't end with Key West, his last assignment in 24 years of Naval service. His next five+ were on a NATO training tour to learn the European System of Communications which was used before satellite communications. Poor guy had to be in Italy to be trained. His travels while on that continent included Corsica, Greece, much of Italy and his favorite, Portugal, where a Dutch girl almost nabbed him...but it was not to be.

Closing the chapter of civilian service, Jon went on to become a Merchant Marine and worked the oil rigs in the Gulf of Mexico (Texas) and then on to rigs in Malaysia. While in Asia, Jon was able to take multiple

Malaysia. While in Asia, Jon was able to take multiple trips to the Philippines along with 4 trips to Thailand and 4 to Singapore.

But one of his favorite memories is of the people of New Zealand where he was invited to a wedding for the daughter of a friend. As travel sometimes goes, Jon encountered some happenstance that could have quickly and easily ruined his trip, had it not been for the help he was offered from strangers in that country. The happy ending led Jon to conclude that the people of New Zealand have to be some of the KINDEST on earth.



Still not "traveled out", Jon has a Bucket List which includes his own heritage, the beautiful country of Ireland, and hey, while he's on the European continent, he just has to "check out" the Czech Republic.

With all these memories of faraway places, Jon has been content since 2015 to play golf in our lovely Florida winters and play poker with the fellows from Beacon Terrace.

In just the short time we chatted, Jon impressed me. As much as he has done in life, he never gave the impression that he was anything but humble. *Refreshing*. He was able to tend to his parents in their later life and meet their needs, but he also has some insights on life and how to live it, such as 'kids need parents' time more than toys'. He also "tooted the horn" for George Jenkins who created an employee-owned company that still invests back into the local community.

Having seen many, many places, Jon is pretty sure Lakeland fits the bill for a fine place to live...and I suspect he might continue to live by his quote from President Andrew Jackson, "Never take counsel of your fears." As we look back at 2020, may we adopt that quote so that 2021 is a fearless one for us. Wishing all of you in Beacon Terrace a happy, blessed and fearless new year!



Euchre, Mexican Train, and Backyard Games are new weekly activities beginning this month. The additions of the games now provide at least one activity for every day of the week.

Euchre and Mexican Train will be held in the Clubhouse while Backyard Games will meet at the shuffleboard courts. Please remember to wear a mask in the Clubhouse.

Euchre is scheduled for Tuesdays at 6:30 pm. Inexperienced players are encouraged to come and learn the game. The card game is a trick taking game with a trump, played by four players in teams of two. In basic play, each player plays one card, the highest card of the suit led wins the trick, unless someone has played a card of the trump suit. An important part of the game is that one of the teams names the trump and must then win the majority of the tricks in that hand. The game is played over several rounds.

Mexican Train will be at 6 pm on Wednesdays. Mexican train is a game played with number dominoes. The object of the game is for a player to play all the dominoes from his or her hand onto one or more chains, or "trains", leaving from a central hub or "station". The game's most popular name comes from a special optional train that belongs to all players. (Wikipedia) Novices are invited.

<u>Backyard Games begins Jan. 15 at</u> <u>1 pm</u>. The game will change monthly, starting with cornhole in January.






