He did not hesitate to discuss issues with the BT community manager, her manager, and their VP, sharing concerns.



Yet along with his efforts, Don admits that "it's the residents that make things happen, not the HOA Board. There is more power and leverage when you all get together, not just the seven residents that staff the HOA Board."

We are fortunate to have had Don in our midst through the COVID-19 era. He truly gave his best possible attention to our needs and concerns. He is, as he describes, a "forward-looking person" who recognized that Beacon Terrace is an evolving community with more full-time residents and different needs.

On the lighter side, Don contributed to the social activities at BT. He orchestrated and was the emcee for Bingo and started cornhole. He also helped with the winter outdoor movie events.

Now that Don and Jane are returning to Wisconsin, they can support their Green Bay Packers, hopefully, in person. I'm sure that their new home will be decorated with the team logo and green colors!



After 6 weeks, I still have evidence that reminds me that my life is definitely enhanced by this certain category of people around me. These people sent messages that let me know they believe I have more life left to live...which seemed really questionable at times when I couldn't bend over as I dropped things and couldn't do simple things like putting socks on or going up and down steps!

So, here it is, late July, and I find myself so very thankful for those people who Walt Disney called Life Enhancers.

My goal going forward:

- * BE a Life Enhancer, even as I seem to so easily drift toward being a Lawnmower.
- * When I see someone I can compliment, I'll just DO it!






