Meet Your New Neighbor:

Meet new resident, Jean Utz... 91 years young, ready to become active here at the park. I'm lucky to be just across the grassy field from Jean and she was a real treat to listen to...no nonsense, upbeat and entirely positive!

As Jean walked me through her place at #77, I looked at the family photos on the wall and asked about her marriage. Jean and Dick met on a blind date and as Jean tells it, Dick never failed to describe how Jean looked that night, in a navy blue dress with white polka dots. They were married 71 years and she says, "It was 71 years of sweetness".

They raised 4 children, 3 boys and a girl, and survived the loss of their oldest son and their daughter. Dick passed before Jean's family moved her to Beacon Terrace this May.

Jean came from a small area near Buffalo, Kenmore Village. She grew up in cold country but after she and Dick spent years in the New York winters, they visited family in Lakeland and returned to New York thinking, "No more snow and no more cold. Let's go!" So, Dick headed south first then Jean drove 2 sons and a daughter, taking 3 days to make the trip. It was June 25, 1950.



Jean and husband, Dick, were married 71 years.

Dick bought a home, "site unseen" to Jean who was shocked to discover their new digs off Harden Blvd. She describes the place as "farmland with an orange tree in the front yard". It was to be their new home. She recalls that Dick carried her over the threshold to that new home off Harden Blvd. The romance continued and they were blessed to have their third son. The affection they held for each other for a lifetime was so evident in listening to Jean tell her story.

And what a story it is! Turns out Lakeland was a great place to raise a family. Lots of other Veterans came to take advantage of the offer to have homes after the war and Jean tells of how there were 7 houses on their street where 7 babies were born in 7 months!! She quipped, "We had 4 children in 6 and a half years. Then we got a TV!" They weren't the only ones having children. She said they renamed the community from the original "Green Acres" to "Fertility Acres"!! Sense of humor...I love it!!

Jean's best friend was a gal named Betty, and Betty and Carl had 10 children. They became friends in New York and both families relocated to Lakeland. Jean recounts the 2 couples playing Bridge up to 4 times a week. "The kids swam in the above ground pool and we played Bridge!"

Jean also played Mahjong and says when moving here just after the war, the Jewish ladies were fun to play with. I asked how that worked after the war, Jean was German; they were Jewish and she said, "Oh, easy. We just loved to play!" Oh, that it could be that simple in our world today.

Jean brought her crafts to the Craft Fair this year...she does lots of knitting and crocheting "to keep my hands busy instead of smoking! I've been smoking since I was 14!!". Yikes!

Jean loved telling about moving to Lakeland where she took a job at Florida Federal bank which at one point in the early '70s was the only financial institution between Southgate and Mulberry. Jean and Dick began long careers in banking, though Dick's career was at Peoples Bank of Lakeland. Great examples of hard work and diligence.

Jean told of times while raising her children when she learned that there were little ones in her boys' class-rooms who were so poor that they came to school without underwear and socks! So Jean used her discount at the Bealls' store to buy these students uniforms and other things they needed. She tells of how she brought her own children to the Boys Club to introduce them to children in poverty...children of migrant workers. Those children were excited to receive one gift from her family for Christmas. Her own children asked, "One gift? They only get ONE gift?" This is an example of how her own children learned to be givers...just like their parents.

Her family is close by. One son, Jeffrey is teaching at Auburndale high school while Richard, lives with his wife at Azalea. One of Jean's 15 grandchildren, a granddaughter who affectionately calls her BearBear, lives in Grasslands. Jean is surrounded by family who love her. She has twelve great grandchildren. Jean can tell you where they live, what they do for a living, without a blink. Yep,

Jean's already befriended the two ladies across the street. As a matter of fact, her neighbor Peggy, worked at Peoples Bank with Jean's husband, Dick. Peggy recognized the name "Utz" on Jean's license plate and later learned of their connection... Small World!!



Jean still drives the 3 miles to Publix and back. She loves Dollar Tree where she can get beautiful birthday cards for her grandkids, who have "too many birthdays in November and December!!" Her knitting and crocheting is on the coffee table for TV time. She loves Ninja Warriors; watches faithfully on Monday nights. She loves baseball and loves her Buffalo Bills and she squealed with delight when I told her I came here from Las Vegas. "Las Vegas?? I LOVE Las Vegas, especially the fountains at the Bellagio!!"

Friends, if you want a treat, I encourage you to meet Jean Utz. You will be happy you did! We are already planning on going to Bridge this Friday on the island. Now that's my kinda gal!!!




