

Yogi Berra—a One of

Well, here's to Fall, my friends! It is Fall and that reminds me of how I miss the leaves changing and the air smelling like wood burning and the temperatures getting cool and crisp as we began to bundle up into warmer clothing. But Fall brings back to mind something else and it came in the form a little white ball that somehow became our National past time.

This month is going to be fun because I'm talking about SPORTS (hey, ladies, no groaning) I think you just might enjoy a little history, a lot of humor.

So, why sports? Well, it just occurred to me that Tampa Bay has almost ALL the bases covered, pardon the expression... but THINK about the pro teams here in our backyard:

Tampa Bay Buccaneers football. Tampa Bay Lightning hockey. Tampa Bay Storm Arena football. Tampa Bay Titans basketball. Tampa Bay Rowdies soccer. Tampa Bay Krewe rugby. And the beloved Tampa Bay Rays baseball. [If I missed a pro team, you just let me know]


Never ever imagined little old Tampa, Fla would be what it is today! Gee, I can remember when all we had in Tampa was a tarmac for boarding a plane OUTDOORS ...then we had to walk up a long outdoor stairway...just like the President uses. But in those days, I never envisioned Tampa having all these professional sports teams.

So, in looking at the time of year we are in, it seemed appropriate to look at one particular sport and even one particular player who made the game so much fun. It was fun in the beginning of his career, fun all through his 19 years of playing and it can still bring a chuckle today.

This 5-foot 7-inch player holds a stunning record in professional baseball. And even if you are one who doesn't particularly LIKE baseball, this career has to impress.

I'm talking about Yogi Berra, who gives total credit for the development of his career to his mentor, Bill Dickey, even taking Dickey's number 8 to be his own. Check these accomplishments of Yogi:

- Led the Yankees in RBIs (runs batted in) for 7 consecutive seasons
- Left Major League Baseball with American League records for
- Putouts: 8,723 and Chances Accepted, 9,520
- Played 88 errorless games in 1958
- At age 37, he caught a 22-inning game which lasted 17 hours against the Tigers-1962.
- Caught a PERFECT GAME, a NO hitter, one of 2 ever played
- There is historic film of him leaping into the pitcher's arms after the 27th OUT!!!
- Imagine a PERFECT GAME...27 outs.
- All Century player of a Major League, named by fans, 1999
- Named to Baseball Hall of Fame, 1972
- His number was retired by the New York Yankees in 1972 when Yogi was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Served in U.S. Navy 1943-1946 (gunners' mate on the USS Bayfield on D Day in France)
- Honored by the Boy Scouts of America with the Silver Buffalo Award, the highest adult honor in Scouts.



- a Kind Sports Role Model

Quite an impressive list, eh? ...especially for a guy who quit school in the 8th grade to help SUPPORT his immigrant family who came to America "in pieces".: His father first in 1909 —-through Ellis Island, then two older brothers who were born near Milan, Italy came next. Finally, his mother. L. P. Berra and his younger brother and sister were then born in America in St. Louis, Missouri.

Ever wonder where the nickname Yogi came from? It seems a teammate and friend, Bobby Hofman, repeatedly teased him, saying that he looked like a Hindu yogi when Berra sat cross-legged while waiting to bat. The name stuck. As I learned about this tremendous record and the contributions the man made to America's past time, I smiled at this one:

Ever see a catcher's finger sticking outside his mitt? Yogi was the first to leave a finger outside the mitt. It is now emulated by most catchers.

I, for one, feel a debt of gratitude to Yogi Berra for the fun, the excitement and the tenacity he displayed for us as we grew up watching him on weekends and year after year heard his name announced on our black and white TVs. He was a household name that everyone knew and we all felt somehow connected to a game that he made fun to watch as we began to endear this fun performer of our beloved sport.

He also raised a family with his wife, Carmen, and as with many long-lived marriages, she preceded him in death just months before his passing. He passed peacefully at his home on September 22, 2015 and that year, following his death, he was appropriately awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. I did a little research to the thought behind choosing a recipient of the Medal of Freedom. It is one that conjures respect, respect for country, and how the life of this one American enriched the lives of fellow countrymen.

May I say that in Yogi's day, I cannot imagine a player of a major league team showing disrespect for his country, including the flag or the national anthem...not when our boys, our fathers and uncles had barely come home from fighting in World War II. As for me, I miss those days of honoring our flag, honoring our country. I miss those days of protecting our president from public embarrassment because of personal failures or physical impairments. I miss those times of respect for each other and respect for National treasures including our display of history, the good, the bad, the ugly of it.

I wonder if you all miss these things too. I guess that is why I wanted to take a nostalgic look back...maybe in an attempt to capture that feeling of safety that we felt in our country, in our Imperfect but united country. I miss that unity. I miss that feeling of safety and that era of respect- respect for others as well as for ourselves. I wonder, do you miss it too?

I wonder what Yogi would say to the state of his country, our country, if he could see the news today, watching the players of the games today. I wonder how he would "manage" his players if he were in the game today. Yes, FREEDOM he earned with his service in our Navy and freedom he enjoyed...freedom of expression, freedom of speech, without fear of being cancelled, without fear of having his words weighed by those disagreeing with his thinking.

As we all know, Yogi made his voice heard when he disagreed with the owner of the team he managed, going as far as to not SPEAK to George Steinbrenner for 14 years after Steinbrenner went back on his word to Berra. Talk about weighing words...your word was your "bond" to these guys and Steinbrenner let Yogi know his word was not to be trusted. An apology finally came after 14 years but for those 14 years, Yogi Berra refused to walk into Yankee stadium, the venue owned by Steinbrenner.

Yogi's words have continued to weigh in, but for us, his fans, it's in a different way... in a way that entertained, especially when it comes to his famous Yogi-isms—probably as well-known to fans as his baseball prowess. Think carefully and smile as you take a look in the rear view at these Yogi-isms and stroll into a time that was a kinder, gentler one. I say, I'm glad we live in a place like Beacon Terrace ...one that is gentle and kind.

Here you go...these are from Mr. Berra, the Yogi himself: "It's déjà vu all over again." "When you get to a fork in the road, take it." "Nobody goes there nowadays. It's too crowded." "Baseball is 90% mental and the other half is physical." "A nickel ain't worth a dime anymore." "We made too many wrong mistakes." "I usually take a two-hour nap from one to four." "Pair up in threes." "All pitchers are liars or crybabies." "If the people don't want to come out to the ballpark, nobody's going to stop them." "You better cut the pizza in 4 pieces because I'm not hungry enough to eat six." But my very favorite of all: "It ain't over til it's over."

In closing, I leave you with another fond memory you surely heard as that announcer yelled out to the crowd just before the start of every game, "Play ball!!!"



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
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
