



Regina Reflects:

Reminiscence of Being

It was first grade, Mrs. McCartney's class. My brother had had her as his teacher for first grade too and everybody knew that Mrs. McCartney was mean. But here I was in her class, shaking in my boots. My poor brother was in third grade with the other terrorist, sorry, teacher... Miss Ziegler. Everybody knew that Miss Ziegler was just awful with young students, so here we were...in the care of the two meanies. My parents had to deal with our fears, our tears and our stories of what these two old ladies did to children in school on a daily basis.

So, low and behold, my mother finally had had it when hearing that Mrs. McCartney refused to allow me to use the restroom after our morning milk break. Guess what happens when an itty bitty bladder is full of milk and the teacher won't let the child use the restroom? Not a great day for me. (and believe me, the bathroom was not like those of today...oh no. This was an outhouse next to our one-room schoolhouse. So, I was not just trying to cut class to spend time in the restroom, know what I mean?)



I had to return to school the next day but the trauma was already in place. So, my parents had their little private talk in the bedroom and my mom let us know that my brother and I were not going to go back to school and live with the stress of these two old biddies. Mom enrolled us in the parochial school downtown. You see, we lived in rural Pennsylvania where the Amish farmed. This meant there'd be no more bus rides and my dad would be driving us to school downtown. My mom had "taken the bull by the horns" and we were pulled out of public school.

Yep, all of a sudden we were going to St. Mary's Catholic school. Enter the Sisters of St. Joseph, completely covered in black and white except for their hands and their faces. Imagine being 5 years old in first grade and going to a new school by November, and when you finally turn 6, you are in this place with no grass on the playground!! All Amacite on the playground of a city school... fall down and there's no way you're going home without a brush burn where your skin's torn off.

But, the trauma of falling down without grass was NOTHING compared to what was waiting on that playground at recess when not ONE girl wanted to invite me to play with them. Imagine...not ONE girl want

you in their activity, not in their jump rope or on their team...not tag, not red rover, not anything they were playing.

It still is as fresh as if it happened this afternoon. It's called "Being Left Out" and it's almost as bad as peeing your pants in front of the whole class!

It's what happens when the new kid, or the smallest kid, or the weakest kid in the bunch is picked last for a game, whether it's kickball, baseball, doesn't matter, somebody is getting Left Out. Being left out has to be one of the most hurtful things you can experience in growing up. Have you been there? A lot of us have, I am sure.

But make no mistake, the fact is that this happens in Adult groups as well. Ever go to a pot luck in a big room as the new one in town? Imagine that Nobody invites you to sit down with their group. The new person is standing there, plate in hand, looking...looking, hoping to be asked to join in, to make a new friend. Are you the one who calls them over? The one who calls out to invite them to join your table or be a part of your group? Or do you stick to your comfortable clique? no newbies invited.

I can remember walking into the clubhouse when a Bridge game was in progress. It was Fall, 2019. As I was meandering, Chuck Snavely welcomed me to come and learn the game and promised me I'd learn if I would show up. That's all it took! I took the invitation seriously and after the Covid "shut down", Bridge resumed and Chuck has been trying to teach me ever since. (slow learner, here) But he stuck to his word. THAT's the kind of person that makes this a great place...an inclusive place. A place that feels like home.

Thanks to all of you who deliberately and consistently open up to new folks and welcome them in. Whether it is a wave from the golf cart or a "Hello" on a walk...it can be a simple thing that can make a person feel a part of Beacon Terrace. Isn't that the kind of place we want to be? I really hope so.

downs inspected NOW, before the storms!









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
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
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
