Beacon Terrace Celebrates 40 Years

On Saturday, March 19th we will celebrate 40 years of Beacon Terrace as a community with a grand bash! A Photo Contest will be held to reflect on the park's beauty.

In 1982, Beacon Terrace Mobile Home Park, designed for residents aged 50 and older, opened for business. Like similar communities sprouting up around Florida, it offered retiring Americans, both from the U.S. and Canada, an affordable home and amenities in the sunshine.



What once had been a field next to a former phosphate mine only two years before, had become three streets almost fully lined with new manufactured homes. Those streets, Azalea, Poinsettia, and Heather, were Phase I of Beacon Terrace.

According to longtime resident Gloria Buerig, who bought her home on Azalea with her husband Howard in 1983, each home had a new palm tree planted in the front yard. The park office was the home on Lot 1, and the back L-shaped pond was being dug.



During Phase II, an office was built where the clubhouse is today. An added laundry room provided washers and dryers not included in the homes. Streets and homes multiplied as the homes sold quickly.

Gloria remembers that the park owners wanted to open the community up to families, but residents objected, and the required age of homeowners was raised to 55. Most everyone joined in projects, such as completing all of the landscaping and property upkeep.

In the final phase (photo above), a large community room was added to the clubhouse where, according to Gloria, dances were held every month with a live band. The card games moved from residents' homes to the new venue. The swimming pool and hot tub offered additional recreation. Later, the outside streets were added and homes planted along Magnolia and Periwinkle.

Today five of the original Phase I residents still live at BT and love to share their fun-filled memories.

I don't know about you, but I am over this Florida winter we have had!

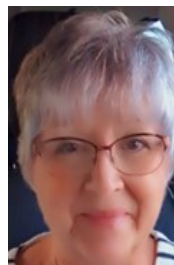
