

There have been a number of times when I've mentioned something to residents about seeing a musical performance here and they look at me wide-eyed and say, "So how did you hear about the concert?" or "We didn't know there's a Lakeland Symphony Orchestra."



Music in the Area:

Polk County Offers Many Musical Extravaganzas

So, I wanted to take time to give you even more options for great music that's happening here...and especially with the holiday season just ahead. Right in our neck of the woods in Central Lakeland are several places to enjoy great music, including, of course, our **RP Funding Center** just down the road from us. But if you drive about three miles on Beacon Avenue, you'll find Lake Hollingsworth and you might want to check out these options too:

- Florida Southern College on Lake Hollingsworth, at Branscomb Auditorium
- Harrison School for the Performing Arts, at Lakeland High School on Lake Hollingsworth Drive.

This school is graduating absolutely amazing high school students who may be accepted to Juilliard School of Music or eventually perform on Broadway in New York. These are extremely talented players and performers, whether in the symphony or in musical theater or any of the other Arts that develop students at Harrison.

I encourage you to take a look at the concerts happening nearby in the next couple of weeks. There is no shortage of delightful entertainment and no need for a fat wallet to enjoy music that's just a couple of miles from here. Christmas music will be in the air through November and December.

- First Presbyterian Church, Bell Choir and Christmas Concert on Lake Hollingsworth
- Lakeland Symphony Orchestra at Branscomb Auditorium
- Florida Southern College on Lake Hollingsworth
- **Polk Theater** in downtown Lakeland, on Florida Avenue
- **First Methodist Church** on Lake Morton, Christmas Concert...drive carefully so you don't injure any of our white or black swans...or our huge white pelicans or our storks, goofy as they might appear...and ducks have the right of way on Lake Morton Drive, just so you know!
- The Lakeland Concert Band, mid-November for 2 performances...their director is so much fun! They might be at any one of the venues mentioned but usually at Branscomb
- Lakeland Community Theater on Lake Mirror downtown (east side of the lake) where great musicals happen!

There's also lots of musical theater at the venue in Winter Haven, just about a half hour from Lakeland...the drive there is on great roads and you don't even have to brave I-4 for the trip!)

The BEST part of all of these options is the price of a ticket! Some are free, but can you imagine seeing a full symphony orchestra for under twenty dollars? (Not since the '70s, maybe the '80s)

Some concerts are performed for donations so be mindful and support our great music. We surely don't want to lose music in Lakeland.



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
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
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
