Well, another Thanksgiving is behind us, and I hope everyone enjoyed the turkey and family get togethers. We thank ELS for providing the turkeys for our Dinner in the clubhouse and a big thank you to Bev Harper for stepping up and hosting the Thanksgiving dinner in the Clubhouse. Also thank you to all the helpers she had.

I recently attended the FMO meeting we hosted at Beacon Terrace and was enlightened to the fact that membership in the FMO has gone from 27,000 members in 2012 to 9,500 as of September of this year. I am also aware that Beacon Terrace membership in the FMO is well below 100%. For the life of me I cannot understand why anyone would hesitate to support this organization that is looking out for our wellbeing. They are constantly working to improve Chapter 723, Florida Statutes to ensure we the homeowners are protected against Park Owners that refuse to act fairly. I encourage those in Beacon Terrace who don't belong to the FMO to please join now and get us to 100%. Remember there is strength in numbers. Membership in the FMO is \$30 for one year and \$75 for three years. Alice Murray in Lot 72 has Applications.

Some good news for a change, the permits for the seawall and dock have now been taken off hold and we should be able to move forward with the repairs. As you are aware the hold was due to the contractor not having a marine license. Well, it appears there was some confusion between the town and the contractor/ELS. The town was under the impression that our lake was part of Lakeland's Lake system and therefore required someone with a marine license. When it was brought to their attention that this was private property and that the "lake" was just a retention pond the town did some research and agreed with us and removed the hold. I have been in touch with ELS District Manager, and I am hoping we can get this resolved after the holidays.

At the December meeting we will be installing three new directors to the board of directors. We have three openings and at the November meeting three residents were nominated. They are Alice Murray, Doug Howison and Bonnie Archibald. Since the number of nominees equals the number of vacancies the nominees will be elected by acclamation.

Please remember that HOA and Social Club dues are for a calendar year, January through December. HOA dues \$15 per lot and Social Club is \$5 per person. Checks should be made out to Beacon Terrace HOA and placed in the interior mailbox of #12, Cathy Nicholson's cubby in the library or given to her at the end of a homeowners meeting.



The Games begin on Saturday February 24th and end on Saturday March 9. Registration begins January 1 and ends February 9. The Games inspire an active lifestyle, combine an interest in sports and games with fun and fellowship, promote a positive image of seniors and recognize their efforts and achievements, and encourage volunteerism.

Competition, held at various locations throughout Polk County, is offered in Archery, Basketball Shooting, Basketball 3 on 3, Billiards, Bocce, Bowling including Team Bowling, Bridge, Chess, Cribbage, Ballroom and Social Dancing, Darts, Euchre, Field Events, Fishing, Golf 18 Hole Singles, Mixed Doubles & Putt & Chip, Horseshoes, Pepper, Pickleball, Punt Pass Kick, Road Race 5K, Scrabble, Senior Smarts, Shooting – Pistol, Rifle, Skeet, Sporting Clays & Trap, Shuffleboard, Softball, Sudoku, Swimming, Table Tennis, Track, and Walking. 


I have been hearing reports about a peeping tom in our community coming from several of you. What concerns me most is that nobody has reported this to Lakeland Police.

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

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
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
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
