#### What does 'Auld Lang Syne' mean?

The phrase "auld lang syne," which literally translates to "old long since," basically means "days gone by."

You might know it as the song that people sing – or at least try to sing – every year on New Year's Eve. Once the clock strikes midnight and the calendar flips to 2024, people around the world will join in a chorus of "Auld Lang Syne."

The lyrics were recorded in a poem by Scottish poet Robert Burns in 1788, though he noted that the song had already been in circulation for years before he put it in writing.

If you feel yourself getting a little teary-eyed and sentimental while singing along, it might not just be the champagne. The phrase is meant to evoke feelings of nostalgia, especially to memories of good times spent with friends, and also serves as a reminder to cherish those fond memories that we've already had, which makes the message a fit for New Year's Eve night. There are five verses to Auld Lang Syne but most people only sing the first verse and first chorus:

Should old acquaintance be forgot and never brought to mind? Should old acquaintance be forgot, and auld lang syne?

For auld lang syne, my dear, for auld lang syne, we'll take a cup of kindness yet, for auld lang syne.

#### **THOUGHTS TO PONDER**

#### "REAR WINDOW "/ FRONT WINDOW

In 1954 there was a movie entitled "Rear Window." It starred Jimmy Stewart and told of a photo-journalist who had suffered a broken leg and was confined to his apartment for the duration of the healing. His window looked out to another high-rise building. Since he was restricted from much movement he spent many hours in the window. The view provided him access to the "goings-on" of many of his neighbors including what he suspected was a murder!

Since we live almost at the very intersection of Poinsettia and Bottle Brush we have a clear view from our Front Window of the postal area. Having been on the HOA Board for a couple of years we heard of many complaints about access to the mail boxes:

- Despite "No Parking" signs, many park in the street ostensibly blocking that lane.
- Some park at the end of Poinsettia blocking that lane and a driveway.
- When a combination of both occurs, it creates a difficulty for turning either from Poinsettia or from Bottle Brush.
- Some even leave their vehicle's door open providing a different hazard for a turn.
- Some park in the ONLY "handicap spot" without a tag and/or block the area next to it with a golf cart so that a person with a walker might have trouble removing it from the side door of a van.
  - Some with a "handicap" tag leave their vehicle in the spot for many hours or a whole day when other spots are available.
- Obviously the "SPEED LIMIT" on Bottle Brush (15 MPH) is the same as the rest of the park, but despite the blocked lane(s) and some walking traffic, the speeds often seem to exceed the limit.
- There is a "STOP SIGN" at the end of many streets but despite the blind corner on Poinsettia some, either in a vehicle or a cart do not stop or even slow down.

Given all these safety issues it might be well to consider some solutions:

- Eliminate the grassy section before the sidewalk to the boxes, pave the area and install the handicap spot adjacent to the walkway, thereby providing a few more Postal Spots.
  - Install 2 "Cart Spots" adjacent to the handicap spot.
  - Install a SPEED BUMP on Bottle Brush just after Poinsettia and before the rear parking section.

These solutions will need approval from ELS and won't occur without their financing the project. However, in the meantime it would be well to consider the safety issues observed. These observations are not offered in a spirit of criticism but of caring for each other.

#### WHAT'S COOKIN' BT

#### CAMPBELL SOUP SWEDISH MEATBALLS

1 pound ground beef

1/4 cup fine dry breadcrumbs

1/4 cup minced onion

1 egg, slightly beaten

2 tablespoons chopped parsley

1 can condensed cream of celery soup

1/2 soup can water

1 to 2 tablespoons minced dill pickle

Mix beef, breadcrumbs, onion, egg and parsley; shape into 24 meatballs.

In a skillet, brown meatballs; pour off drippings. Stir in soup, water, and pickles.

Cover and cool over low heat for 20 minutes; stir often. Serve with rice or noodles. Recipe makes 4 servings.


If you ask Wilma, she'll tell you her friends encouraged her to ask Jack to go to a dance at the golf course. That sealed the deal.

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




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
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
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
