Hello Everyone,

As the new president of the HOA I feel there are a few items that should be brought to your attention.

First, I think you all should be aware of what your HOA does for you. As you might know, the HOA represents all of the BT Home Owners but if you pay your HOA dues you get to vote on the things brought forward at meetings.

Some of the things your HOA has done this past year are:

- Purchased the Christmas lights and decorations for the park.
- Purchased the new shed, picnic tables and the lids for the barbque pits on the island.
- Put in 2 Bocce Ball courts.
- Leveling of the pool table in the Clubhouse.
- Lighting over the shuffle board courts.
- Purchasing all the supplies for clubhouse i.e. Saturday morning coffee, etc.
- Bought a new fridge for the Clubhouse.
- · Pay Legal Fees for running the HOA.
- Pay Insurance for running the HOA and the Clubhouse.
- Provides free pizza after golf cart parades.
- Cover extra costs when the social events fall short.

In saying all that, the main source of income for the HOA is the dues from BT homeowners and the Annual Rumage (Bazaar) Sale. Without the HOA dues and Annual Sale, the HOA will not be able to continue as it has in the past.

Out of 297 houses in our park, we only had 113 HOA Members in 2025 (not even half of our homeowners), This steady decline has been due to losing older members and new homeowners moving in and not supporting or understanding how important HOA is to their community.

We are having an Early Bird Special if you pay your dues by Dec 31st, the fee is only \$15 per household. As of January 1st the fee will be \$20 per household.

Those of you who knew Sandy, know that she truly was "My Better Half".

We would practice together, spend a night at one of their band members homes and then give a concert for each other's school and residents.

This is how Sandy and I met. I stayed at the home of a neighbor of Sandy's. We began to date and fell in love with each other. I went to a local college and we continued to date. I didn't have a car at the time, so I would hitchhike down to see her. This continued for almost four years. I went with her to home coming dances, and proms, football games, basketball games, and all the normal high school functions. I knew her classmates as well as she did. Sandy graduated on June 4th and we married on June 20th, 1964. In September 1965 Deborah Lynn was born. It's a wonder how she ever grew up to be the wonderful woman she is, because her parents, namely Sandy and I, didn't have a clue how to be parents. Three years later we had Jodie, our second beautiful daughter. She also turned out to be a wonderful woman.

Sandy was a saint. I changed jobs and we moved from Ohio, where we both had been born and raised, to Independence, Missouri where we knew not a soul. I took her away from all family 1,100 miles from "home". Oh, and I failed to mention that we had a two-year-old and she was 7 months pregnant with Jodie when we moved.

After about 15 years in Missouri, my job took us to Illinois, to the suburbs of Chicago. Shortly after moving Sandy decided to follow her long-time desire to be a nurse and started her collegiate career at 37. She graduated magna cum laude and had her RN degree. She had earned a scholarship from a local hospital and started working nights as soon as she got her license after acing the state test. We lived in several suburbs around northwest Chicago. Most of this time, my job required a lot of travel, so my "Better Half "raised our two daughters. Sandy is the primary reason they turned out to be wonderful successful women.

Sandy and I became Grandparents. It's been Grammy's/Mimi's and Papa's joy of our lives to have JD and Hope as a part of our lives, even though we only had Hope for 12 years before a brain tumor (DIPG) took her from us. JD was a very successful athlete and ranked fourth in the state in cross country. JD has followed in his parent's footsteps and after graduating from Carthage, is a teacher and coach in a Milwaukee suburb.

Sandy and I decided to retire and move to Lakeland Florida and Beacon Terrace in 2012. Up until the last two years we have been very active in the park. Health problems took us out of most activities. Sandy and I made many good friends and have appreciated those friendships.

I appreciated all of the support I have received helping with Sandy's care particularly this last year. As most of you are aware, I lost my "Better Half" on December 4th. I didn't realize that I could miss anyone as much as I miss her. I realize that she is no longer in pain and for that I am grateful. Thanks for all the love and support you have given me.





# 2026 Polk Senior Games

Polk Senior Games is an annual two-week series of 37 Olympic-style sports and games for men and women 50 years of age and older. The Games inspire an active lifestyle; combine an interest in sports and games with fun and fellowship; promote a positive image of seniors and recognize their efforts and achievements; and encourage volunteerism.

Competitions are held at various locations throughout Polk County and include: Archery, Bag Toss, Basketball, Shooting, Billiards, Bocce, Bowling (including Team Bowling), Bridge, Chess, Cribbage, Ballroom and Social Dancing, Darts, Euchre, Field Events, Fishing, Golf (18 Hole Singles, Mixed Doubles, and Putt & Chip), Horseshoes, Pepper, Pickleball, Punt Pass Kick, Road Race 5K, Scrabble, Senior Smarts, Shooting (Pistol, Rifle, Skeet, 5-Stand, Sporting Clays, and Trap), Shuffleboard, Softball, Sudoku, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Track, and Walking.

Gold, silver, and bronze medals are awarded in each event and age division.

Registration begins January 2, and the deadline is Friday, February 6.

There are two ways to register for the Games:

The base entry fee is \$13, and each event is \$6. Facility fees are required for certain events: \$40 for Golf Singles,

available for participants entering more than seven events.

Additional team fee applies for Softball.

All participants receive a T-shirt.

#### Neighborhood Watch and "Signs of Life"

Greeting Neighbors, from your Neighborhood Watch. I am pleased to say that our program is well underway for keeping an eye on those among us who are living alone here in Beacon Terrace. I like to call the program, "Signs of Life". We are placing signs in the windows of these neighbors that are Bright Green on one side, with a message, that says Good Morning, and Bright Orange on the other side with a message that says Good Night. These signs are checked twice a day for their presence and for the correct message for the time of day and/or the time of night, with a process to get in touch with the resident and confirm that they are ok, or get help for them if they do not respond if the sign is not in synch with the time of day. This program allows us to be aware of our neighbor's well being at least twice a day by simply observing purposeful signs, that let us know you are here, and that you are ok. Please contact me if you are living alone, or if you have a neighbor you would like to see enrolled in the program.
